Active Travel (Wales) Act 2013 Reporting Duties

In accordance with the duties under sections 7 (3) and 10 (2) of the Active Travel (Wales) Act 2013, please find **Ceredigion County Council's** annual report for the year 2019-20.

The actions taken to
promote active travel
journeys

262 pupils completed Kerbraft training, which was lower than anticipated due to commencement of Covid-19 restrictions in March 2020.

322 pupils completed the National Standard Cycle Training which fell short of the target number, again due to Covid-19 restrictions.

CCC Road Safety section also supported the Sustrans community bike rides in the Aberystwyth – Talybont areas as ride leaders and also promoted Walk to School Week.

The Authority continues to host the Sustrans Schools Officer for West Wales with office and administrative support provision for the post holder.

The Sustrans Schools Officer has continued to deliver the Sustrans Active Travel Promotion programme to a number of Primary Schools in Ceredigion, along with promoting various events e.g. The Big Pedal Challenge and Walk to School Week.

The actions taken to secure new active travel routes and related facilities and improvements

Devil's Bridge Footway Scheme (Local Transport Fund)

New section of footway constructed as the 3rd and final phase of previous Safe Routes in Communities scheme footway construction in Devil's Bridge. This new footway competes the link between the Vale of Rheidol and the village centre with tourist amenities, which attract high numbers of visitors.

Lampeter, College Street Pedestrian Crossing (Local Transport Fund)

New controlled pedestrian crossing constructed to current Active Travel design standards with associated tactile paving, signing and road markings at this Town Centre location.

IBERS to Penrhyncoch Shared Use Path Scheme (Active Travel Fund)

Land purchased from Aberystwyth University to accommodate construction of approximately 1.2km's of

new shared use path provision between IBERS at Plas Gogerddan and Penrhyncoch.

This was the Phase 2 part of the scheme providing a new traffic-free active travel connection between the communities of Bow Street and Penrhyncoch. The scheme tied into the new Aberystwyth Innovation and Enterprise Campus (AIEC) development at Plas Gogerddan and also with the new Bow Street Rail Station & Interchange.

NB. due to Covid-19 delays this scheme construction was carried over to the following FY2020-21, therefore please also refer to the subsequent Annual Report.

Core Allocation Grant (Active Travel Fund) Minor works schemes included:

- Aberystwyth Cycle Signage Scheme new cycle signs installed to improve destination route finding and highlight connectivity to NCN Routes 81 and 82.
- Glanyrafon Industrial Estate Scheme new dropped kerbs and tactile paving installed to improve accessibility, where provision did not previously exist.
- Piercefield Lane Junction, Penparcau footway
 widened to shared use path provision and new
 dropped kerb and tactile paving installed to improve
 accessibility. This improvement was undertaken
 ahead of future housing development on the former
 Tollgate Public House Site where a requirement on
 the developer to provide a new shared use path was
 conditioned as part of the planning consent for this
 site.
- Aberystwyth University Cycle Parking new cycle compound with increased capacity installed near the Porters Lodge, providing enhanced protection from the weather. Electrical connection also made for installation of 2 no. E-Bike Charging Stations within the new compound. The Public Bike Repair Station was re-installed at this location creating a 'mini-cycle hub' for students and visitors to the University.
- Market St, Lampeter pedestrian and mobility user access improved with installation of new on-street 'build-out' facility outside the Town Library. The scheme also included new tarmac surfacing of the pedestrianised area which is a well-used and popular link in the Town Centre.

The Core Allocation Grant has also funded continued scheme development work on proposed Future Routes and land purchase negotiations with key stakeholders.

Rhiwgoch Footway Phase 2 Scheme (Safe Routes in Communities Grant)

Construction commenced on the 2nd Phase of new footway and the scheme also included traffic calming measures to help reduce vehicle speeds and volume.

Scheme included installation of new scooter and cycle shelters in the schools at Aberaeron.
