Toilets for Public Use

During May's Age Friendly Ceredigion Forum an issue was raised regarding public toilets in Ceredigion.

We have spoken with colleagues in the Economy and Regeneration Department of Ceredigion County Council and have been advised:

"Ceredigion did have a Toilet Strategy in place from 2018, but a revised version has not yet been published. At present, we are awaiting approval from Full Council on an interim statement that addresses this. As part of a broader restructuring effort, the management and responsibility for public toilets are in the process of being transitioned away from the County Council. The intention is for these facilities to be operated by local community groups and Town/Community Councils going forward where possible. I am also aware of the Welsh Government's digital Toilet Map and understand the importance of ensuring its accuracy. I will review Ceredigion's entries on the map as soon as possible to check that the information is up to date. If you or your group have specific concerns about certain locations, feel free to share them and I'll do my best to direct them to the appropriate channels."

The national toilet map is a map of toilets identified by local authorities as available for public use. The map includes public toilets, toilets in public buildings and some toilets owned by businesses. It shows the type of toilets at each location such as baby change facilities and Changing Places. Find toilets open to the public COV.WALES

You do not have to be a customer to use any toilet listed on the map. There is also <u>Toilet Map: Home</u>. The project aims to map all publicly-accessible toilets – that means all toilets that the public can access without needing to be a customer. Anyone can go on the website and <u>add, edit or remove toilets</u>.

Draft Disabled People's Rights plan

The Welsh Government has launched a consultation on its Draft Disabled People's Rights plan, setting out a positive ambition for advancing the rights and opportunities of all disabled people across Wales over the next decade. The plan is based on the work of the Disability Rights Taskforce, which brought together people with lived experience and expertise. It addresses real challenges faced by disabled people in their everyday lives and

outlines both immediate actions and long-term outcomes to create lasting change in how society addresses barriers to inclusion.

The 12-week consultation welcomes input from individuals, community groups, businesses and organisations, with particular emphasis on hearing directly from disabled people about their priorities.

The consultation is open until 7 August 2025.

Have Your Say: Review of Ceredigion Household Waste Sites

Ceredigion County Council is reviewing its Household Waste Sites and is asking for your views.

The site at Glanyrafon (Aberystwyth) is the only facility in the north of the county and is also the busiest. For these reasons, the Council would prefer to keep it open.

In mid-Ceredigion, the sites at Rhydeinon and Lampeter serve overlapping areas.

Cilmaenllwyd provides a facility for residents in the southwest of the County.

The Council is proposing to suspend use of the Rhydeinon site while continuing to operate the other sites as normal. This would align with the Council's aim to deliver services across three geographical areas, as set out in its Corporate Strategy.



Changes to Ceredigion's Waste Collection Service

From 23 June 2025, Ceredigion County Council will limit residual waste ("black bags") collections to three bags per household every three weeks. This change aims to increase recycling rates—currently, around 50% of black bag contents could have been recycled, with food waste making up 24%.

There is no limit to recyclable materials placed in clear

bags, food waste bins, or glass boxes, if used correctly. Absorbent Hygiene Product (AHP) bags provided by the Council are also excluded from the limit. Households that genuinely need more residual capacity due to specific circumstances (e.g. disability or excess non-recyclable waste) can apply for an exemption. The application form is available online.

Residents must sort their waste before visiting Household Waste Sites. Unsorted black bags will need to be opened and sorted on arrival. Proof of residency is also required. This change brings Ceredigion in line with all other Welsh councils, supporting better recycling and reducing landfill.



Update from the Welsh Government Warm Homes Nest scheme

Nest has updated its eligibility criteria, meaning more households in Wales could now qualify for free home energy efficiency improvements.

If a property qualifies but isn't suitable for a heat pump, and the existing boiler is at least 12 years old, a new boiler may be offered instead.

To qualify for free energy improvements (such as insulation, a heat pump, solar panels or a boiler), households must:

- Own or privately rent their home
- Receive a means-tested benefit, live on a low income, or have an eligible chronic health condition
- Have an EPC rating of 68 (D) or lower
