## **Annex 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS**

### **1 Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol**

(1) Where a premises licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions.

(2) The first condition is that no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

(a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

(3) The second condition is that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence

must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

### **2 Mandatory condition: exhibition of films**

(1) Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the licence must include a condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with this section.

(2) Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection

(3)(b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body.

(3) Where-

(a) the film classification body is not specified in the licence, or

(b) the relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

(4) In this section-

"children" means persons aged under 18; and

"film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c.39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

### **3 Mandatory condition: door supervision**

(1) Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, the licence

must include a condition that each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

- (2) But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed-
- (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c.12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or
  - (b) in respect of premises in relation to-
    - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
    - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).
- (3) For the purposes of this section-
- (a) "Security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and
  - (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an Occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

## **The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2014**

**With effect from 28<sup>th</sup> May 2014**

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1-
  - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
  - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula –
$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
where –
    - (i) P is the permitted price
    - (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
    - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol
  - (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence –
    - (i) The holder of the premises licence,
    - (ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
    - (iii) The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
  - (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
  - (e) “valued added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.  
  
(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) (Amendment) Order  
2014

The below Mandatory Conditions **replace** the Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010 and comes into effect **on 1<sup>st</sup> October 2014**

**Conditions 1 to 4 refer to all premises that sell or supply alcohol for consumption on the premises. Condition 3 is relevant to Premises that sell for consumption off the premises.**

1. (1) the responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

(a) Games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

(i) Drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) Drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

(e) Dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).



**2.** The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

**3. (1)** The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

(a) A holographic mark, or

(b) An ultraviolet feature.

**4.** The responsible person must ensure that—

(a) Where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.”

## **Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule**

### **a) General**

This event is for Ceredigion Young Farmers Annual Rally Day and is the highlight of the year with the organization, 18 clubs and over 700 members come together and compete in a variety of competitions. Traditionally a dance is organized for the evening of the County rally.

Last year Lledrod YFC was victorious at the Rally and therefore will host the Rally for 2019 in partnership with Ceredigion YFC. The Rally and Dance will be held at Ynysforgan, Lledrod, Aberystwyth, Ceredigion SY23 4HX . The Dance will be held in a large agriculture shed. The County and Club will have a wealth of support plenty of support, experience on hand during the course of the evening to ensure the smooth running of the event and to meet all the licensing objectives.

### **b) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder**

We will have a minimum of 10 stewards during the course of the evening, and these will be situated from the road entrance, the car park, the entrance to the shed complex and at all entrances/emergency exits/stage area within the shed. We will also have 12 registered security staff to be situated at the main entrance to the complex and also within the shed. These Will include 2 female persons and at least ½ (50%) of the staff will be bilingual. From 18:00 -20:00 hrs. 4 SIA will be deployed

We will not allow admission or serve alcohol to anyone who is drunk, violent or behaving disorderly. Anyone behaving in this manner will be asked to leave and if necessary the police will be informed and notified.

### **c) Public Safety**

One of the main concerns regarding public safety is to ensure that our organisation takes all necessary steps in guaranteeing a safe entrance and exit to all persons attending the event. We will ensure that the main entrance to the car park will be well lit. There will be at least 3 stewards in fluorescent

Jackets at the car park and main entrance and several extra stewards will be on hand at the end of the dance, as people leave the event. No glass bottles, beer glasses, cans or spirit bottles will be allowed in to the main complex.

Security officers will have the right to search any bag or handbag or clothing if there is any suspicion of bottles or unsafe items. The security officers will do this at their own discretion. A notice will be posted on the entrance to the event stating that persons may be searched.

Searching, any other potentially dangerous item will be confiscated if it is deemed to be used to cause harm. We will ensure that any emergency vehicle needed on site will have clear access. The St. Johns Ambulance service will be present on site throughout the event. Fire extinguishers will be placed at appropriate locations around the complex and within the proximity to the stage area. Water and fire Blankets will also be available. Public liability will be in force and our insurers will be made aware of the Application.

d) **Prevention of Public Nuisance.**

WE will notify Residents within the area, we will have plenty of stewards to keep watch of the shed throughout the night. At the end of the evening we will have plenty of Stewards to ensure that all persons evacuate the premises as quickly and as safely as possible thus reducing Traffic and road safety accidents. Live and recorded music will be played during the day for competitions but restricted to Bar area for the evening Dance.

e) **The Prevention of Children from Harm**

Children under 16 year olds will only be allowed entry if they are accompanied by a responsible adult. All persons aged 18 years and over will be provided with a wristband. Any persons suspected of being under the age of 18 will be asked for ID and if this cannot be produced then no wristband will be issued and therefore that person would not be served alcohol. The bar staff will be briefed beforehand and all staff will be experienced with serving alcohol. Our Stewards and security staff will not

tolerate under any underage persons consuming alcohol, and the security staff will deal, with this matter at their discretion

There also will be a soft drinks bar available for persons under 18's, and for other persons who do not wish to consume alcohol at the event. Officials and Club Leaders, and stewards present at the event will all have been DBS checked.
