Crynodeb o'r Materion / Summary of Issues	
<p><u>Interim Well-being Plan</u></p> <p>As members will be aware, to ensure statutory obligations are met during the merger process, both Ceredigion and Carmarthenshire PSBs have agreed to develop a light-touch Joint Interim Local Well-being Plan covering an 18–24-month transitional period, until the publication of the next full Local Well-being Plan in 2028.</p> <p>A dedicated Well-being Planning and Reporting Task & Finish Group is leading on this work. Its primary purpose will be to coordinate the preparation of the interim plan for adoption by the merged PSB from September 2026 onwards.</p> <p>The aims of this group in producing an interim plan at the earliest opportunity will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ensure continuity of delivery across the existing priority activities of both PSBs. • Provide strategic direction during the transition period leading to merger. • Guide the work of the merged PSB for 18–24 months until the next statutory Local Well-being Plan (2028–33) is developed. <p>This approach allows for a smooth transition between current local arrangements and the future governance model, ensuring no loss of momentum or statutory compliance.</p> <p>Tasks and Early Work</p> <p>The first phase of work focuses on mapping current delivery, drawing from the existing Local Well-being Plans and associated current activity and workstreams in Ceredigion and Carmarthenshire.</p> <p>Initial findings indicate:</p>	

- **Significant overlap** between the substantive priority areas of both PSBs.
- **Clear opportunities to align activity, outcomes, and delivery structures.**
- Strong potential for a coherent and streamlined set of joint priorities for the transitional plan.

Evidence Base

Support teams have reviewed the current Local Well-being Plans (2023–28) for Ceredigion and Carmarthenshire, alongside progress trackers and performance information, to begin shaping a shared evidence base.

This work will produce:

- A reviewed set of current priorities.
- A cross-referenced assessment of progress and delivery status.
- An **emerging outline** for the proposed Joint Interim Light-touch Plan.

Subject to formal approval of this approach, the Task & Finish Group will also coordinate the preparation and publication of the **2025–26 Local Well-being Plan Annual Reports**. These reports will serve as a natural transition point—concluding the two current Local Well-being Plans and creating a clean handover into the Joint Interim Plan.
